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Cultural context and vocabulary

Shabbos: Shabbat, or the day of rest, is traditionally celebrated in Jewish homes from Friday evening through sundown on Saturday. A special meal, often with chicken or brisket, is common on Friday evening, along with candle-lighting and prayers over bread and wine.

Schochet: Jewish dietary laws specify that an animal must be butchered in a particular way to reduce its suffering in order for the meat to be *kosher*. Butchers trained according to these laws were known as *schochets*..

Talmud Torah: A part-time school that taught Hebrew and Jewish topics to children who attended after their public school day.

Yiddish: The language spoken by Jewish immigrants from Eastern Europe, Yiddish is a mixture of German and Hebrew and is written in the Hebrew alphabet.
