

Public Relations Guidelines for CT Summer at the Museum

1) Update your website with the 2023 CT Summer at the Museum Logos.

You can find the logos in the grantee resource section on the <u>CT Summer at the Museum Grants</u> webpage.

It is extremely important that you also clearly provide on your website the specific information visitors need to know about how the program is being implemented at your museum.

2) <u>Update your Social Media Channels (if applicable).</u>

3) <u>Send an email to your state legislators and Governor Lamont thanking them for</u> supporting the CT Summer at the Museum program in 2023.

4) Draft and distribute a press release.
